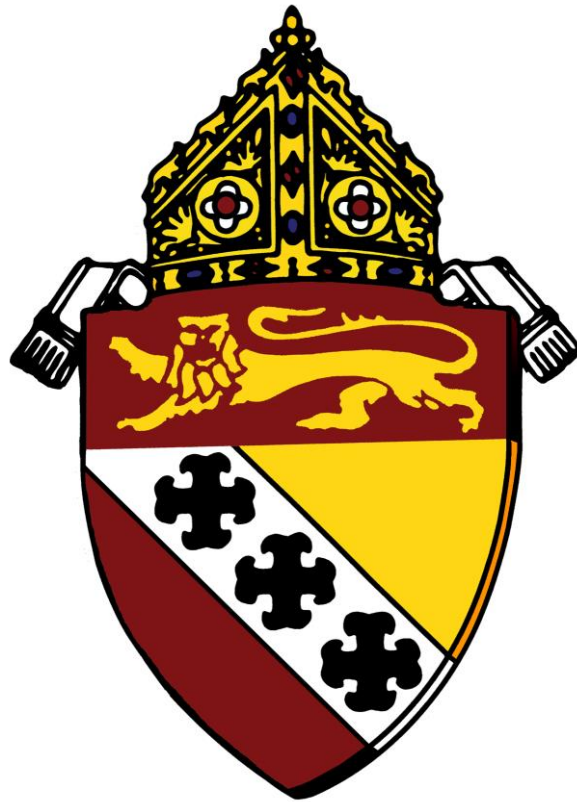

Dear Scout Leaders, and Crew Advisors:

The Diocese of Charleston Catholic Committee on Scouting invites you to the 2019 Catholic Camporee to be held at Camp Barstow, 115 Ruby Riser Road, Batesburg, SC 29006, the weekend of September 27-29, 2019. We are asking that each patrol or troop bring canned food to help feed the poor of SC. Extra points will be awarded for groups that brings at least one can for every registered member of the unit.

The Scouts BSA troops, and Crews, will be camping in their own area. Girls Scout/AHG and Cub Family camping will be apart from each other in their own camping area. The Camporee will include both Boy & Girl BSA Troops/Crew/ Squire/Girl Scout/AHG and Cub Scout/Brownies/Juniors events. Camporee competition awards will be presented following Sunday morning service. All registered Scouts are invited, regardless of religious affiliation. The program is designed to promote awareness of Catholic life and prayer through the activities of Scouting.

We encourage scouts whose troops are not attending the Camporee, and wish to take part, to attend. We ask that leaders of units chartered to Catholic organizations welcome all Scouts in their parishes, even if they are members of different units. Lone Scouts who wish to attend are also welcome. Please contact the Camporee Scoutmaster for assistance. We encourage each troop to search out Catholic Scouts that may be a part of their parish, a neighboring parish, or a troop of another faith.

The secret to the Camporee's success is the support of volunteers. Each unit is asked to complete the attached volunteer form to let us know how you can help. Each unit must also supply volunteers to help with meal preparation and clean up. We are in need of Safety range officers. Please help us to find help so that all ranges can be opened.

The cost for the weekend is \$13.00 per person and it includes the camp fee, a Camporee patch, lunch on Saturday, the Rosary patch if earned at the religious station and completed by saying the Rosary on Saturday night. Make checks payable to DCCCS. If you are registering with your unit, we need one check from the unit, not individual checks from each family. For security reasons, everyone must wear a bracelet given out at registration.

We will present each Scout BSA/Venture/Cub Scout that has earned his/her religious emblem over the past 12 months with an embroidered neckerchief as Bishop Guglielmone's gift to the Scouts. Dear Cub Scout Leader:

The Diocese of Charleston Catholic Committee on Scouting invites you to the 2019 Catholic Camporee to be held at Camp Barstow, 115 Ruby Riser Road, Batesburg, SC 29006, the weekend of September 27-29, 2019. We are asking that families bring to cans of food to give to needy children in SC.

The Scouts BSA troops, and Crews, will be camping in their own area. Girls Scout/AHG and Cub Family camping will be apart from each other in their own camping area. The Camporee will include both Boy & Girl BSA Troops/Crew/ Squire/Girl Scout/AHG and Cub Scout/Brownies/Juniors events. All registered Scouts are invited, regardless of religious affiliation. The program is designed to promote awareness of Catholic life and prayer through the activities of Scouting.

Your unit may attend the Cub Scout portion of the Catholic Camporee either as an overnight camp or as a day event. We encourage all Cub Packs to camp; however, we have set the schedule to allow Cub Scouts to attend the Camporee as a day event.

You are responsible for meeting the Cub Scout Family Camping and leadership requirements for the event. We urge you to make this a Cub-and-Parent event to give the greatest number of Cubs the chance to participate. Cub Scouts, who are not affiliated with a Pack chartered by a Catholic Organization, you will be placed either with a Pack or a group of Cub Scouts to form a Pack to participate in the activities. Please email me at hoven@sc.rr.com if you have any questions about this or any suggestions for programs or events that you feel would be fun and interesting for the Cub Scouts.

We will present each Cub Scout that has earned his religious emblem over the past 12 months with an embroidered neckerchief as Bishop Guglielmone's gift to the Scouts. If a scout has earned either the Light of Christ or Parvuli Dei, we can arrange for the bishop to present their emblem at the camporee if they have not received it in their parish. Please identify all Scouts who will be recognized at registration. If you have someone that could help with the music please let us know. Please invite your pastor to attend the event, either as a participant or a visitor. Priests are welcome and encouraged to visit the camporee at any time. Cubs can audition a skit or song and can participate if chosen.

Please register in advance. Use the enclosed Pack Registration Form to register your pack at check-in. This will help the Camporee staff with meal planning for day visitors, site location for overnighters, and event staffing. Please note that everyone will be responsible for their Saturday Evening meal. The cost for the weekend is \$13.00 per person and it includes the camp fee, lunch, a Camporee patch, the Rosary patch if earned at the religious station. Make checks payable to DCCCS. If you are registering with your unit, we need one check from the unit, not individual checks from each family. For security reasons, everyone must wear a bracelet given out at registration.

Dear Girl Scout and American Heritage Girl Leader:

The Diocese of Charleston Catholic Committee on Scouting invites you to the 2019 Catholic Camporee to be held at Camp Barstow, 115 Ruby Riser Road, Batesburg, SC 29006, the weekend of September 27-29, 2019. We are asking that each troop bring canned food to help feed the poor of SC. Extra points will be awarded for groups that at least one can for every registered member of the unit.

Girl Scouts, American Heritage Girls, and Family camping will be set apart from the Boy Scouts. Each troop must have an outdoor trained leader with them or plan to partner with a troop who does have experienced personnel. Please inform the Girl Scout Camporee Leader if your troop needs to partner with another experienced troop.

The Camporee will include both Girl Scout/Boy Scout/Crew and Brownie/Cub Scout events. We encourage Girl Scouts to include Juniors/Cadettes/Seniors/Ambassadors and Brownies to camp with us. Brownies will participate in the Cub Scouts Events and Girl Scout Juniors and above will participate in the Boy Scout Events. Brownies can come and participate for the day if preferred, cost will remain the same. Camporee competition awards will be presented Sunday morning for older scouts. All registered Girl Scouts are invited, regardless of religious affiliation. The program is designed to promote awareness of Catholic life and prayer through the activities of Scouting.

We encourage Girl Scouts whose troops are not attending the Camporee, and wish to take part, to attend. We ask that leaders of units chartered to Catholic organizations welcome all Scouts in their parishes, even if they are members of different units. Juliette Scouts who wish to attend are also most welcome. Please contact the Camporee Girl Scout Leader for assistance.

We will need volunteers to assist with events. Adults should assume that they will assist with an event. Each unit must also supply volunteers to help with meal preparation and clean up. We will ask for the names of those volunteers at check-in.

The cost for the weekend is \$13.00 per person and it includes the camp fee, a Camporee patch, lunch on Saturday, the Rosary patch if earned at the religious station and completed by saying the Rosary on Saturday night. Make checks payable to DCCCS. If you are registering with your unit, we need one check from the unit, not individual checks from each family. For security reasons, everyone must wear a bracelet given out at registration.

We will present each girl that has earned her Catholic religious emblem over the past 12 months with a gift to the scouts from Bishop Guglielmone. If any Brownie or Junior would like the Bishop to present them with their religious award please provide the information and awards at check-in. Please identify all Scouts who will be recognized at registration. Please invite your pastor to attend the event, either as a participant or a visitor. Priests are welcome to visit the camporee at any time. If any clergy will be attending, please call Father Matthew Gray at (803) 254-7646. Mass will be celebrated on Saturday night at 5:00pm.

An additional 20 points will be awarded to each troop that is pre-registered by September 20th. The cost for the weekend is \$13.00 per person.

CAMPOREE ACTIVITIES SCHEDULE

Each troop /patrol / den will carry their score sheet from event to event and will be responsible for turning it in at the completion of all events for compilation of awards and prizes.

Each troop / patrol (or den), and each Scout needs to come prepared for the Camporee events. The table below lists necessary items. All Troop/Patrol/Den items should be packed in a container that is portable and can be carried by a single member of the unit. The scout should carry all individual items.

Patrol/Den Items	Bible, First Aid Kit	First Aid Kit

This will be checked at each station.

CAMPOREE AWARDS

Points are awarded throughout the weekend based on patrol participation, activities, behavior, safety, and task completion. Awards are presented to participating patrols based on the point distribution throughout the weekend.

EARLY REGISTRATION – 20 Points

Points are awarded to units that register before the early registration deadline defined in the invitation letter in this document.

DONATED SUPPLIES AT CHECK-IN – 25 points

Points are awarded to units that provide the supplies requested to be donated to other needy organizations.

SKIT AUDITION & SELECTION – 20 points

10 points are awarded to any patrol that does an audition for an appropriate skit at the time specified. 10 additional points are awarded to the units that are selected to perform at the campfire on Saturday night.

PATROL FLAG – 45 points

Points are awarded based on the judging criteria defined below.

SITE INSPECTION – 20 points

Points are awarded to all patrols of each unit who have their campsite in proper order and properly identified. Sites will be inspected throughout the day as activities are taking place. Safety, neatness and cleanliness, evidence of scout spirit and similar aspects will be reviewed. In order for a unit to earn points, the unit number must be clearly displayed in the area of the campsite.

CAMPOREE ACTIVITIES – 30 total points at each activity

PATROL PARTICIPATION – 10 points at each activity

Points are awarded based on active, attentive participation from each patrol team member.

SAFETY – 5 points at each activity

Points are awarded based on patrol members exhibiting safe behavior throughout the activity, following rules as defined by each activity.

PATROL BEHAVIOR AND SPIRIT – 5 points at each activity

Points are awarded based on patrols that display a spirit of teamwork, cooperation, enthusiasm, and encouragement for each other, and helpfulness to others.

UNIFORM – 5 points at each activity

Points are awarded based on the presentation of class A or B uniforms by the patrol. Uniformity, scouting theme, and design can be taken into account.

ACTIVITY SUCCESS – 5 points at each activity

Points are awarded based on successfully completing the activity as defined.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Points may be awarded to patrols who participate in other special activities throughout the day.

SCOUTMASTER AWARDS

Awards may be presented to any patrol or patrol member that is recognized by any staff member for performing special services, volunteering, or showing scout spirit in a special way.

PATROL FLAG CRITERIA

There are 45 total points in the Patrol Flag Contest. Please review the criteria carefully. Judging standards and their consistency are important to the success of the contest and will ensure fairness in all levels of the patrol flag contest. Scoring is on specific achievements, not on general categories.

Originality	Design	10 points
	Creativity, uniqueness	10 points
Identity	Patrol identification	5 points
	Troop identification	5 points
Workmanship	Flag Construction, youth made	5 points
	Suitability of height and shape	5 points
	Mobility and use by patrol	5 points

Originality: The flag should depict a theme or idea related to the patrol name on the flag.

Identity: The patrol must be properly identified with a printed or designed name. For example, for the Road Runner patrol, the flag would have a road runner bird design.

Workmanship: The flag should demonstrate workmanship and initiative in its construction and design. Flags should be youth-made and all members should have had a part in their construction and design.

Each patrol must carry its patrol flag throughout the day as judging will be at one of the activities during the day. The patrol flag should always be displayed near the patrol area. The flag should be mobile and not too cumbersome for one flag bearer to handle and carry around with the patrol at the camporee.

THE CAMPFIRE PROGRAM

The campfire program will consist of singing, skits, and story-telling. All invited units are welcome to participate.

The patrol or troop leader should submit and audition the skit at the time indicated in the camp schedule. ALL SKITS SHOULD BE UPLIFTING and avoid the portrayal of violence or inappropriate themes. The skits should be written and presented in a spirit of fun while not making fun of others. Skits should in keeping with the Catholic Camporee theme, a bible story, or original story with a positive Christian theme is ideal. Originality is highly encouraged!

Skits should be rehearsed, in advance. (Be Prepared!) Remember to speak LOUDLY and CLEARLY. An announcement will be made after mass if your patrol has been selected to present your skit at the campfire.

CAMPOREE GUIDELINES AND USEFUL INFORMATION

| PURPOSE | The purpose of the Catholic Camporee is to bring together Catholic Scouts for scouting events and Christian fellowship. The Camporee will give each Scout, den, patrol, pack, crew and troop a chance to learn and demonstrate a range of skills and to have FUN. |
| PRE-REGISTRATION | All units should pre-register to earn 20 extra points and to help the committee with program planning. Early registration cutoff is September 20, 2019. Fee is \$13 per person. |
| PREPARATION | Each patrol is encouraged to practice basic scouting skills in preparation for the Camporee and to be prepared. Review upcoming events to ensure patrols are prepared. Remember Troop, Patrol, Pack, and Den flags. |
| LOCATION | Camp Barstow, 115 Ruby Riser Road, Batesburg, SC |
| CHECK-IN | <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Registration opens at 5 p.m. on Friday, September 20th. Scoutmasters, Crew Advisors, Cubmasters, Girl Scout Leaders, AHG leaders or their designees should report to registration right off the parking lot near the totem pole.2) Guidelines for dropping off gear and emergency vehicles will be provided at registration. Parking for Boy Scouts will be in the overflow parking area. Absolutely no parking on the entrance road or curve at the bottom of the parking lot. Violators will be towed. |

- 3) **ALL VEHICLES EXCEPT EMERGENCY VEHICLES MUST BE RETURNED TO THE DESIGNATED PARKING AREA AND NOT MOVED DURING THE CAMPOREE. NO EXCEPTIONS!**

CRACKER BARREL AND SPL MEETING

The Camporee Committee will address last minute details, schedule changes, and other matters the Cracker Barrel and SPL meetings. SPL, Scoutmasters, and Cubmasters Girl Scout Leaders, or their designee are invited to attend.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

There will be a first aid station designated at the camp. However, units are reminded to bring their own first aid kits for non-critical emergencies.

PATROLS

The intent of the Camporee is to challenge patrols, circles or troops to work as a team. Troops should not try to put together super patrols. Event Patrols, Camping Patrols, and Cooking patrols must be the same.

PERMISSION SLIPS

Units are also reminded they should have all necessary medical forms as required by the Guide to Safe Scouting.

LEADERSHIP

Two-deep adult leadership is required on-site during the entire Camporee. Packs should follow the guidelines set forth about adult/scout ratios including with sleeping arrangements. The SPL of each Troop is responsible for all youth leadership and their patrols.

CAMPING

Each troop/pack will camp as a unit following BSA/GSA/AHG guidelines, Camporee style, in tents. Each unit is responsible for its camping gear.

UNIFORMS

Scouts and Scouters are required to be in uniform at Friday check-in and those events marked on the enclosed schedule. At events not marked, scouts must wear activity uniform as designated by their units. Point deductions will occur at each activity when members are out of uniform. Points will be deducted for non-scouting or non-religious themed head wear.

GARBAGE

DO NOT bury any garbage.

DUTY ROSTER

Troops must be post duty rosters for each patrol. Guidelines for campsite inspections should be followed as all campsites will be inspected.

MEALS / FOOD

The Camporee registration includes lunch on Saturday. Units should also plan for any snacks or other food needed by scouts during the weekend.

CAMPSITE

Campsite judging is designed to teach scouts the fundamentals of good camping habits, safety, comfort, cooking, health, and sanitation using the patrol method. DO NOT DITCH TENTS.

CHECK-OUT

Site inspection and checkout will be conducted on Sunday following chapel services. All units should be ready for inspection prior to chapel services. A Camporee staff member will inspect each site and report back to the Camporee Scoutmaster. ALL CAMPOREE PATCHES WILL BE PRESENTED AT CHECKOUT based on a successful site inspection.

CAMPFIRES	No campfires unless in designated fire rings or in elevated fire pit. Campfires are to be shared with all units in your campsite.
EVALUATION FORMS	Evaluation Forms, one for SPL's and one for adults will be handed out to each unit to fill out. Returning these forms will be part of the checkout procedure. Please take time in filling it out. It is an important tool needed to offer programs and facilities that the scouts can learn through and enjoy.
QUESTIONS/CONCERNS	Any questions or concerns regarding judging events should be reported to the Camporee Scoutmaster by the Troop's SPL or to the Camporee Cubmaster by the Pack Cubmaster, or Girl Scout Camporee Leader.
GUIDELINES FOR THE RECEPTION OF COMMUNION	<p>Catholics: In order to be properly disposed to receive Holy Communion, Catholics should be in a state of grace and have fasted (except for water) for a period of at least 1 hour prior to receiving the Body and Blood of our Lord.</p> <p>Non-Catholics are welcome in joining in the celebration of the Eucharist in a spirit of prayer. In keeping with the teaching of the Catholic Church, non-Catholics should refrain from reception of Holy Communion. Non-Catholics may approach the minister of communion for a blessing.</p>

Camporee Rules to Live by

Here are a few rules that apply to our Camporee that we sometimes forget.

- No one rides in the back of a truck
- If it doesn't have wings, don't throw it. This includes sticks and stones, especially rocks around the lake.
- No running except on the playground area.
- No open-toed shoes, except in the showers.
- No bare feet, except at the waterfront and showers
- Scouts should always walk with a buddy and should never be sent to the campsite or any area alone.
- Campfires should be completely out and cold to the touch before leaving the campsite or retiring for the evening.
- No one should walk with an open knife
- All holes dug for any purpose should be filled
- No food inside a tent or in the adirondacks
- No scouts may smoke, adults must smoke out of the view of scouts.
- Wear full uniform to check-in, Living Rosary, Mass, Award Ceremony, and the campfires.
- The possession and/or use of alcohol is strictly prohibited and will result in immediate removal from camp!

From I-26, take the Newberry exit (exit 74) go right on 34 two miles to 76
Go left on 76 for about 6 miles and go right on 391.
Stay on 391 for about 11 miles. You will cross over Lake Murray twice.
Turn Right (West) onto SR 4159. You will see a brown sign directing you to
Camp Barstow.
Stay on SR4159 for 2.8 miles.
Turn Right at the Camp Barstow sign. Follow the signs for about 0.5 miles into
Camp. Parking area is on the left.

For those coming from Rock Hill . . .

From I-77 exit 48 and take 200 west,
At Winnsboro take 34 west 35 miles into Newberry
Go left on 76 for about 6 miles and go right on 391.
Stay on 391 for about 11 miles. You will cross over Lake Murray twice.
Turn Right (West) onto SR 4159. You will see a brown sign directing you to
Camp Barstow.
Stay on SR4159 for 2.8 miles.
Turn Right at the Camp Barstow sign. Follow the signs for about 0.5 miles into
Camp. Parking area is on the left.

For those coming from the East and South . . .

From Lexington, head west on US-378 / US-1
When US-1 and US-378 split, stay Right on US-378.
Stay on US-378 for 17.5 miles until you arrive at the Saluda Traffic Circle.
From the traffic circle, take your first Right onto US-391 (North) toward
Prosperity.
Travel on US-391 for 1.6 miles.
Turn Left onto SR 4159. You will see a brown sign directing you to Camp
Barstow.
Stay on SR4159 for 2.8 miles.
Turn Right at the Camp Barstow sign. Follow the signs for about 0.5 miles into
Camp. Parking area is on the left.

For those coming from the Southwest . . .

Take exit 33 and go north on Hwy 39 for one mile.
Take a right on 391 North approximately 20 miles.
When you cross Hwy 378 you will go approximately 1.6 miles.
Turn Left onto SR 4159. You will see a brown sign directing you to Camp
Barstow. Stay on SR4159 for 2.8 miles.
Turn Right at the Camp Barstow sign. Follow the signs for about 0.5 miles into
Camp. Parking area is on the left.
